

## *Delta Upsilon Scholarship Program Fall 2009*

**I**-Mandatory Library/ House study log in sheets for members with a grade point average (GPA) below a 3.0 previous semester average (PSA). Members must log their time spent in the library in the provided binder located in the library. Study hour may only be completed in the house due to group projects, mentoring, etc... with permission from the Vice-President of Scholarship. Members who do not log in their required weekly hours will be fined \$15 by the Vice-President of Finance.

- Those members with a GPA PSA above 3.0 will not be required to log in study hours
- Members with a GPA PSA between 2.75 and a 2.99 will be required to log in 3 hours a week.
- Members with a GPA PSA between a 2.50 and a 2.74 will be required to log in 4 hours a week.
- Members with a GPA PSA under a 2.5 will be required to log in 5 study hours a week.

\*If written documentation by a professor is provided a member may calculate his current GPA and if his current performance exceeds his prior GPA, study hours may be shortened. However, said member will be required to continue to provide written documentation every other week to the V.P of scholarship and his Scholarship Review Board to insure performance is not weakened as the semester progresses.

\*If any member is given an Early Warning Grade Report, the member will be required to a) receive mandatory weekly tutoring by either a WIU sponsored tutor or a Delta Upsilon member who has volunteered his time for the Delta Upsilon Tutoring Program and is experienced in the course and approved by the V.P of scholarship and/or his scholarship review board. Documentation of successful meeting will be required or b) if the Member in question chooses he may drop the said course pending grade and date.

**II** – Any Member or pledge earning a previous semester average GPA of 2.5 or below or a current cumulative GPA of 2.25 or below will immediately be placed on academic probation for the period of one semester. A cumulative GPA of 2.5 or higher will be required to stay off academic probation in the Spring 2010 semester.

-In the following semester if the member in question rises his cumulative GPA above a 2.5 he will be released from academic probation.

-If the member in question does not receive a semester GPA higher than 2.49 then he will be suspended or expelled from the Chapter.

-If the member in question does not succeed in raising his cumulative GPA above a 2.5 he will remain on academic probation for an additional semester only if they raised their semester GPA at least 1.0 above their previous semester GPA and their current cumulative GPA is greater than a 2.249.

-If a member remains on academic probation for the period of two semesters and does not raise his cumulative GPA to above a 2.49 then he will be suspended or expelled from the Chapter.

\*If after the 4<sup>th</sup> week of school written documentation by a professor is provided to the Vice-President of Scholarship and the member's current GPA can be calculated, and it will increase the members cumulative GPA to greater than 2.5 the member can be removed from academic probation. However, said member will be required to continue to provide written documentation every week to the V.P of scholarship and his Scholarship Review Board to insure he is continuing to uphold the required GPA. If his GPA falls below the requirement he will immediately be put back on academic probation.

\* Academic/social probation is as follows: No brother who has been issued academic probation will be able to participate in any Fraternity Social events unless they are acting as a sober monitor for the social event.
